The 15th edition of the International Symposium on Neuropsychiatry & HIV will take place in hybrid format on **11,12 and 13 May, 2022**.

This Symposium has a practical focus on the diagnosis and treatment of the psychiatric and neuropsychological aspects of HIV-infected patients. The Symposium will discuss the topics that may be of special interest to HIV professionals: Risk behavior, Factors of vulnerability in HIV (people at risk) and risks of HIV infection in the brain.

WEEPI extraordinary call for proposals

WEEPI is launching an extraordinary call for proposals aimed at supporting clinical or implementation projects focusing on provision of HIV, viral hepatitis or tuberculosis-related care for people from Ukraine who have either remained in the country or left their home to a neighboring country as a consequence of the conflict. The call will seek to support projects documenting generalisable results and lessons learned for the provision of care in similar emergency situations.

Proposals from the following countries are eligible: Hungary, Republic of Moldova, Poland, Romania, Czech Republic, Slovakia and Ukraine.

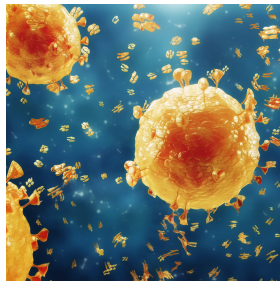
The course is divided into two parts: in-depth online distance learning run over 3 months, later followed by a 3-day face-to-face workshop.
