### 17th European AIDS Conference

The next biennial European AIDS Conference will be organised in Basel from November 6-9, 2019.

The early registration fee will apply until **July 12, 2019**. A reduced fee is available for allied professionals, students and community members. Registering early will give you the opportunity to register to the pre-educational course, the WAVE workshop, and the meet-the-expert sessions, which are free of charge but organised on a first-come first-served basis.

The main sessions of the Conference will be translated into Russian and we hope that this will give the opportunity to Eastern-Central European countries to increase their participation.

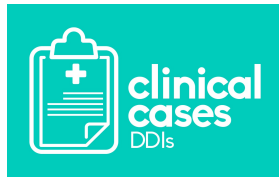
### CAHR HCP Travel Awards Competition
