A symposium on "Fast-track cities. Calculus for Success: Fast-Track Cities on a Pathway from 90-90-90 to Getting to Zero" will take place on November 9, 2019, 10:00-10:45. This session will be available in Russian.

The 'calculus for success' that is fueling the acceleration of urban HIV responses in Fast-Track Cities includes political commitment, equity-based data, community engagement, stigma elimination, and mobilizing financial resources. This session will feature presentations and a moderated discussion among local stakeholders from five Fast-Track Cities in Europe that are implementing the 'calculus for success' and achieving progress towards attaining (of have surpassed) the 90-90-90 targets on a trajectory towards getting to zero new HIV infections, zero AIDS-related deaths, and zero stigma.
