Participants from accross the world join the HIV Summer School in Prague



On 9–13 September the HIV Summer School took place in Prague, Czechia, bringing together physicians and clinical scientists specialising in infectious diseases and HIV from around the world.

The course was led by an experienced faculty of key opinion leaders in HIV clinical care and research. Teaching sessions included a mix of plenary lectures, which provided participants with the latest updates in HIV clinical science, and an overview of clinical research methodology. This was followed by interactive small group workshops led by the faculty.

Participants chose between two main modules. The research module offered in-depth exploration into the complexities of developing a research proposal, while the clinical module focused discussing various clinical cases on antiretroviral therapy, drug resistance, HIV prevention, opportunistic infections, and co-morbidities.

At the conclusion of the week, participants in the research module presented their proposed research projects, while those in the clinical module engaged in a debate on various clinical issues, with groups taking opposing sides on key topics.

Social activities, such as the poster walk, where participants showcased the HIV landscape in their home countries, gave them the opportunity to network and exchange experiences.

Upcoming EACS Standard of Care meeting in Athens

The 2024 EACS Standard of Care meeting for HIV and co-infections in Europe will take place in Athens, Greece, on 16-17 October 2024. Under the theme "Standard Care for All: Embracing Those Left Behind," this event is co-organised by Greece and Türkiye, highlighting the region's pivotal role at the crossroads of Western, Central, and Eastern Europe.

This closed meeting will gather around 100 HIV experts, community representatives, and institutional partners from across the WHO European region. Over a day and a half, participants will engage in plenary sessions and discussions to assess progress in HIV care and address challenges across Europe.

Key topics include HIV and STI care for migrants, fighting stigma and discrimination in healthcare, and ensuring health equity for all through both plenary and breakout sessions.

Follow the EACS Guidelines session at HIV Glasgow: 2024 update and CV risk recommendations

On Wednesday, 13 November 10:15-11:30 GMT, the EACS Guidelines session will take place at HIV Glasgow. The session will cover the 2024 updates of the EACS Guidelines and will address CV risk recommendations.

The session will be chaired by Prof. Jürgen Rockstroh and Dr Juan Ambrosioni.


