Croatia

University Hospital for Infectious Diseases

Description:

The University Hospital for Infectious Diseases (UHID) is the leading Croatian hospital for the diagnostics and treatment of infectious disease. Croatia has a centralised system of care for people living with HIV, with all of them being treated at UHID in Zagreb. Currently we provide care for about 1600 people living with HIV. UHID is also the Croatian Reference Center for the diagnosis and treatment of people living with HIV. The HIV care at UHID includes outpatient and inpatient care including intensive care unit management. We also provide HIV care for pregnant women and children. HIV specific laboratory tests (CD4 cell count, HIV-RNA, resistance testing, confirmatory HIV testing, etc.) are also done at UHID. The Outpatient Department also provides post-exposure prophylaxis and pre-exposure including on-site treatment of major STIs. UHID is one of the EUROSIDA and RESPOND centers and contributes data to those cohorts. An mHealth solution is also implemented at the Center which facilitates the interaction between health care professionals and PLWH. Several research projects funded by the Croatian science Foundation that covered a range of research interest areas were conducted: HIV resistance, syphilis, rapid ART, cardiovascular risk, opportunistic infections, treatment in the intensive care unit, mHealth).

Our research interests mainly focus on STI prevention and treatment, comorbidities management (e.g., metabolic, neurocognitive, cardiovascular, sexual health, bone health), and co-infections.

Bellvitge University Hospital

City: Barcelona

Description:

The Bellvitge University Hospital is a teaching and tertiary public hospital located in the south of the metropolitan area of Barcelona. The hospital is associated with the University of Barcelona and the Bellvitge Biomedical Research Institute.

In the HIV and STI Unit we have currently 1900 HIV patients in care who are attended in the outpatient clinic 5 days/week (from Monday to Friday). In addition, about 500 individuals are included in a PrEP programme. We also offer medical care to people with STI.

All the members of our team are involved in clinical research. We are currently participating in more than 20 clinical trials and research projects focused on:

- Antiretroviral therapy: phase 2 and phase 3 clinical trials with new ARV
- PK of ARV drugs in CSF, genital tract and rectum
- HIV-related complications
- STIs (including specific studies on HPV).

We also collaborate in multi-centric cohort studies (PISCIS cohort; CoRIS cohort)

Fields of expertise:

 - Pharmacology, especially PK in anatomic sanctuaries (CNS, genital tract, rectal tissue) and drug-drug interactions
 - Multi-drug resistance
- Opportunistic diseases
- Metabolic disorders (including MAFLD) and cardiovascular risk
- Neurocognitive impairment
- Sexually transmitted infections
- HPV and HPV-related anal cancer
- HCV co-infection

University Hospital Vall d'Hebron

City: Barcelona

Description:

The Vall d'Hebron Hospital HIV / STI Unit develops its activity in 4 areas of care:

- 1) Outpatient Consultations and Day Hospital. This unit currently manages approximately 2,300 patients living with HIV.
- 2) Unit of Sexually Transmitted Diseases Vall d'Hebron-Drassanes. In 2024, this unit handled nearly 5000 visits for sexually transmitted diseases. We also have a PrEP Unit which currently controls 2100 people on PrEP.
- 3) Anal dysplasia screening unit (UCDA). In this Unit, we perform high resolution anoscopy and treatment of high-grade dysplasia lesions. We visit about 800 patients annually, with about 80-100 new patients yearly.
- 4) Hospitalisation of patients with opportunistic infections.

From the point of view of research, a Basic Research Laboratory focused on reservoir research and functional HIV care.

We have a Clinical Research Unit for conducting clinical trials in phases I, II and III.

From a teaching point of view, the Unit organises an annual update course on HIV infection and another on STIs.

Hospital Universitario La Paz-Carlos III

City: Madrid

Description:

The Hospital La Paz-Carlos III is a university community hospital with almost 4000 people with HIV under routine clinical care in the HIV outpatient clinic. We have an inpatient ward for acute HIV-related complications, and an outpatient clinic dedicated to STI and PrEP users. We are participating in more than 20 clinical trials with novel and marketed drugs and have our own academic research proposals in the following areas: ART simplification strategies, co-morbidities in people with HIV (metabolic and cardiac complications, NAFLD/NASH, ageing, and novel biomarkers of ageing). We are also involved in translational research in partnership with the AIDS and Infectious disease research group in IdiPAZ led by Professor Jose R Arribas. We also have close collaboration with the non-HIV infectious diseases section, tropical medicine and travel health and dermatology department (HPV and anal cancer screening programme).

Fields of expertise:

- Antiretroviral treatment. Simplification strategies in ART. Clinical trials of new HIV drugs
- Viral hepatitis
- Co-morbidities in people living with HIV (cardiovascular, metabolic clinic, viral hepatitis, NAFLD/NASH)
- Novel biomarkers of ageing in people with HIV (Telomere length, Epigenetic clocks, DNA methylation)
- Neurocognitive impairment and mental health in people with HIV.

Türkiye

Ege University School of Medicine

City: Izmir

Description:

The clinic hosts an HIV cohort of around 1200 adult patients. There are three academic staff members interested in HIV. We usually see 40-50 follow-up patients and 2-4 newly diagnosed patients each week. We are also running an STI clinic on several days of the week. The microbiology department in our



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hospital runs HIV screening and confirmation tests as well as STI PCR panels. Our ongoing and developing studies and projects are:

- * Real-world data on DTG+3TC use among treatment-experienced people living with HIV in Türkiye
- * Scaling-up HIV testing among inpatients: How to raise awareness and change behavior?
- * HIV screening for indicator conditions at the emergency department
- * Early HIV diagnosis with anonymous testing among key populations (at the development stage)
- * Changes in sexual behavior and lifestyle among people living with HIV after HIV diagnosis: A qualitative and quantitative study (at the development stage)
- * Trends in the epidemiology of STIs in Europe (at the development stage)
